### Philosophy

## Eligibility Criteria/Admission Requirements:

- The candidate should be a Registered Nurse and Registered midwife or 1. equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
- The minimum education requirements shall be the passing of : 2. B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks.
- The candidate should have undergone in B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing in an institution which is 3. recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
- Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing. 4.
- Minimum one year of work experience prior or after Post Basic B.Sc. 5. Nursing.
- Candidate shall be medically fit. 6.
- 5% relaxation of marks for SC/ST candidates may be given. 7.

#### Entrance/Selection test

Selection of the candidates should be based on the merit of the entrance examination held by University or competent authority.

## Regulations for examination:

## Eligibility for appearing for the examination:

75% of the attendance for theory and practicals. However 100% of attendance for practical before the award of degree

#### Classification of results:

- 50% pass in each of the theory and practical separately.
- 50-59% Second division
- 60-74% first division
- 75% and above is distinction
- For declaring the rank aggregate of 2 years marks to be considered

If the candidate fails in either practicals or theory paper he/she has to reappear for both the papers (theory and practical)

Maximum no. of attempts per subject is three (3) inclusive of first attempt. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 years

Candidate who fails in any subject, shall be permitted to continue the studies into the second year. However the candidate shall not be allowed to appear for the Second year examination till such time that he/she passes all subjects of the first year M.Sc nursing examination

If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and practical).

Maximum no. of attempts permitted for each paper is 3 including first attempt.

- The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 (four)

- 8. A candidate failing in more then two subjects will not be promoted to the IInd year.
- No candidate shall be admitted to the subsequent IInd year examination unless the candidate has passed the 1st year examination.
- Maximum number of candidates for all practical examination should not exceed 10 per day.
- 11. Provision of Supplementary examination should be made.
- 12. All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.
- One internal and One external examiners(outside the University) should jointly conduct practical examination for each student
- 14. An examiner should be M.Sc (N) in concerned subject and have minimum of 3 (three) years post graduate teaching experience.
- One internal and One external examiners(outside the University) should evaluate dissertation and jointly conduct viva-voce for each student
- 16. For Dissertation Internal examiner should be the guide and external examiner should be Nursing faculty / nursing expert in the same clinical speciality holding Ph.D./M.Phil/M.Sc. Nursing with a minimum of 3 years experience in guiding the research projects for Post Graduate students of Nursing.

#### **Admission Strength**

Annual admission strength for M.Sc (N) Programme should have prior sanction/permission from the Indian Nursing Council on the basis of clinical, physical facilities and teaching faculty.

#### Health Services

There should be provisions for the following health services for the students.

- (a) An annual medical examination.
- (b) Vaccination against Tetanus, hepatitis B or any other communicable disease as considered necessary.
- (c) Free medical care during illness and / provision of health insurance should be made.
- (d) A complete health record should be kept in respect of each individual students. The question of continuing the training of a student, with long term chronic illness, will be decided by the individual college.







- c. At least 80% of all the clinical requirements should be completed before appearing for the final (second year) examination.
- d. The principal of the ANM School should certify for each student that she has undergone successfully the internship program, completed 100% of the clinical requirements and acquired the requisite competencies as listed in the syllabus before the award of the certificate/diploma by the state nursing council/examination board.

The casebook and competency record book should be completed and signed by the competent authority of the school before appearing for the second year practical examination.
