NOMOPHOBIA AMONG MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL IN MCH WING
AND BABA EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY INSTITUTE OF
PARAMEDICAL COLLEGE OF NURSING.**

ABSTRACT - Nomophobia is considered a modern age phobia introduced to our lives as a by product of the interaction between people and mobile information and communication technologies, especially smartphones. This study sought to contribute to the nomophobia research literature by identifying and describing the dimensions of nomophobia and developing a questionnaire to measure nomophobia. Mobile phones are changing behavior, relationships, communication and the dynamics of physical environments. As such, reliance on the device for everyday activities has increased. Consequently, "nomophobia", defined as the fear of being without one's mobile phone, has emerged as a new phobia. The current study aimed to determine if nomophobia can increase the likelihood of problematic dependent, prohibited and dangerous mobile phone use. Mobile phone use has increased markedly over the past 5 years and has been related to "no mobile phone phobia" (so-called nomophobia). The 20-item Nomophobia Questionnaire (NMP-Q) is the only instrument that measures nomophobia. Technological progress not only brings with it resources that improve and facilitate the day-to-day life of the people who make up society but also entails health risks, with the emergence of terms, such as nomophobia, which is considered an anxiety disorder produced by the fear that not having a mobile phone generates in a person.

INTRODUCTION - Nomophobia is defined as the fear of being without a mobile phone. Or unable to use it. "Nowadays, it is considered a modern age phobia." It is to be considered as a form of behavioral addiction.

Nomophobia, a state of sociopsychological illness, refers to a fear of lack of access to mobile phone, which is thought to be a modern age disorder that causes negative health risks and harmful psychological effects. This study aimed to determine the relationship between the smartphone use and nomophobia disorder among medical professionals. Nomophobia is No Mobile Phone Phobia – the fear of being without a mobile device or beyond mobile phone contact. The time and money wastage by medical professionals is a negative aspects of mobile phone dependence. This time can utilized for academic and recreational activities. Smartphones make it possible to perform a variety of daily tasks in one device, including, but not limited to, calling and text messaging, checking and sending



email messages, scheduling appointments, surfing the Internet, shopping, social networking, searching for information on the Internet, gaming, entertainment, etc. (Park, Kim, Shim, & Shim, 2017). Because smartphones are ubiquitous and provide numerous capabilities, Kang and Jang (2014) propose that smartphones go beyond serving communication, information and entertainment purposes. They state that smartphones enable people to "fulfill needs such as learning, individual capability, safety, and human relationships" (Kang & Jang, 2014, p. 177), which is attributed to the mobility of smartphones. While the mobility of smartphones provides apparent benefits and enable individuals to satisfy their basic needs (Kang & Jang, 2014), it may also induce some problems associated with smart-phone use. Previous studies have shown that smartphones may cause compulsive checking habits (Chittamuru et al., 2012). **Smartphones**. The use of smartphones has increased, and this has made smartphone addiction a significant public health concern in recent years. **Nomophobia** is considered a disorder of the contemporary digital and virtual society. In general, it is the pathological fear of remaining out of touch with technology. The portable smartphones allow for shorter use periods of multiple internet-based mobile applications ("apps") in contrast to relatively long periods of computer-based internet use. Smartphone addiction has been considered to be a technological addiction, which is defined as behavioral addictions of a nonchemical nature that involve human-machine interaction.

Nomophobia has been observed as a growing fear and problematic consequence of mobile phone use in young adults. It is a term used to describe by combining phobia and no mobile phone use where the individuals might experience anxiety, discomfort, nervousness and anguish out of fear of not being in contact with their technology.

Other characteristics that individuals might show include spending most time using mobile phone (on average 34 times a day) always keeping it switched on, sleeping in bed with it, looking at the screen to check calls and messages, feeling anxious at the thought of losing or misplacing phone, or apprehensive when it is not charged, or has no signal coverage. It is a newly emerging psychiatric disorder among mobile phone users.

Mobile phone use severely damages to our health, both physically and mentally. The characteristic symptoms of nomophobia include overuse of a mobile phone and the resultant feeling of disturbance when there is a lack of network coverage, the battery is out of power, or the balance between the two is not enough. In addition, people with nomophobia would frequently check their phones for messages or missed calls, and they are repeatedly under the illusion of hearing a mobile phone ring or vibrate. All these symptoms

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because of the problematic use of a mobile phone would inevitably affect people's social life, work productivity, and academic performance in a negative way.

To evaluate this situational phobia among affecting mobile phone users, Vitellus and Corrada first developed the Nomophobia Questionnaire (NMP-Q) in the United States in the English language as an effective instrument.


Some limitation which is depends on resources of the investigator and they are termed as delimitation of the study. Following are the delimitation of the present study -

The nonophobia questionnaire section included the 20 items developed as a result of the first, qualitative phase. All 20 items in NMP-Q are rated using a 7-point Likert scale, with 1 being "Strongly Disagree" and 7 being "Strongly Agree" only at the extremes. Total scores are calculated by summing up responses to each item, resulting in a nonphobiascore ranging from 20 to 140, with higher scores corresponding to greater nonophobia severity. NMP-Q scores are interpreted as follows: an NMP-Q score of 20 indicating the absence of nonphobia; an NMP-Q score greater than 20 and less than 60 corresponding to mild level of nonphobia; an NMP-Q score greater than or equals 60 and less than 100 corresponding to a moderate level of nonphobia; and an NMP-Q score greater than or equal to 100 corresponding to a severe Nonophobia.







Basic Life Support, or BLS, generally refers to a level of medical care which can be provided by trained medical personnel, including emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and by qualified bystanders for victims of life-threatening illnesses or injuries until they can be given full medical care at a hospital.

College of Nursing, Baba educational society and Medanta Hospital, Gurgaon jointly organised two days basic life support Session on 18/04/2023 and 19/04/2023 from 10am to 5pm, which was conducted by experts from Medanta hospital, Gurgaon. 

